# DAIDA Foundation's vision of Public Infrastructure and Public Spaces

Cities are full of inequities. Social and environmental injustice decide the quality of many in the lower part of the socio-economic pyramid. Financial inequities exacerbate the problem.

It is through Public Infrastructure and Public Spaces that some of these inequities are addressed within cities. e.g. :

- Inclusive public transportation can allow poor and rich, old and young, women and men to commute to their work or leisure.
- Vibrant public spaces such as plazas and public squares allow those with little private space at home to lounge at ease
- Parks and urban forests and riverfronts allow all to refresh their lungs and more.

Most importantly Public Spaces and Public Infrastructure provide a chance for people from different social and

economic strata to meet each other. For, in true public spaces and other manifestations of public infrastructure, ideally all citizens - whatever their place in the social or economic pyramid have the same rights.

Amid global challenges like climate change, biodiversity loss, natural disasters, and urban decline, public infrastructure and spaces play a vital role. During crises such as floods, heatwaves, or pandemics, they offer adaptable infrastructure that supports emergency response and strengthens community resilience. Thoughtfully designed and managed public spaces are thus not only essential for environmental sustainability but also for enhancing the health, safety, and cohesion of urban communities.

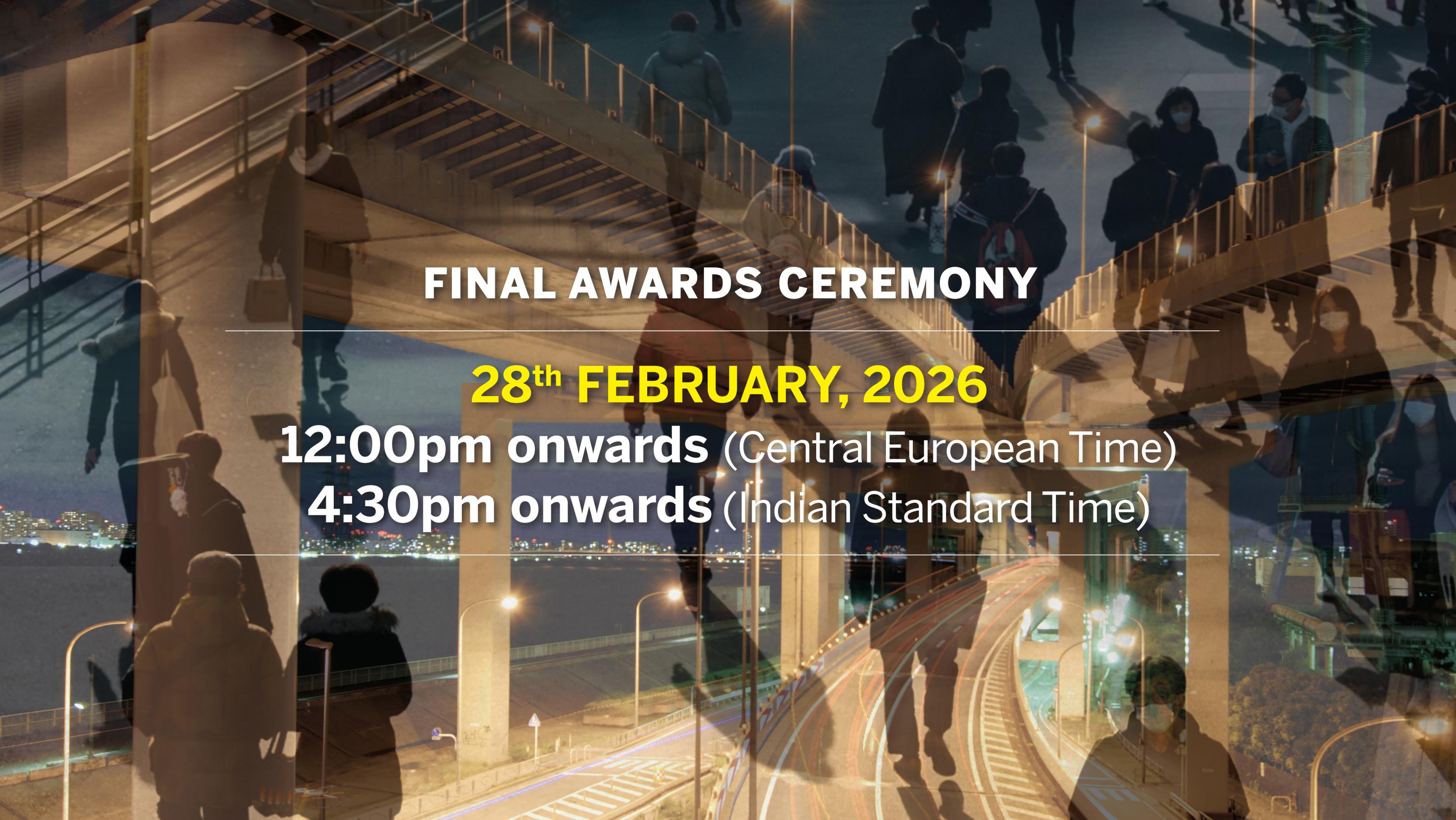
